IYSTERY TRAIN - Images of America in Rock 'N' oll Music. By Greil Marcus, E.P. Dutton & Co., Inc. 3.95.

Greil Marcus is a rarity in rock music writing. He voids fanzine enthusiasm while skillfully telling the efects of rock 'n' roll on America's culture.

For example, the reader can't understand America day without taking the full measure of Elvis Presley's rusic, according to Marcus.

The book is divided into two sections: Ancestors and theritors. The Ancestors are Harmonica Frank (1951) nd the legendary Robert Johnson (1938). Marcus lays ne foundation for modern day music by explaining the iteresting roles these two artists played. The Inheritors re The Band, Sly Stone, Randy Newman and Elvis.

The most fascinating chapter focuses on Elvis Preey. To understand the 1950's, James Dean and grease ou must understand Elvis. Robert Johnson's legacy is ttested to by many leading rock musicians, including ie Stones.
